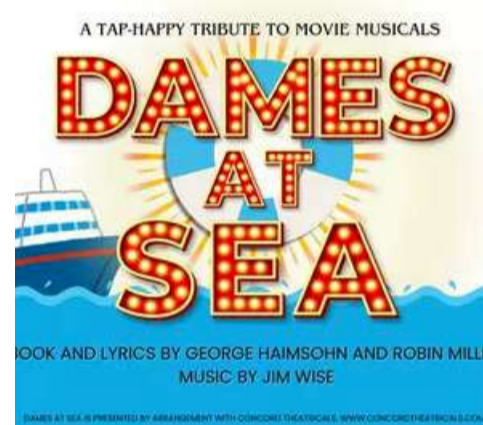
**A NEW THEATER GROUP**

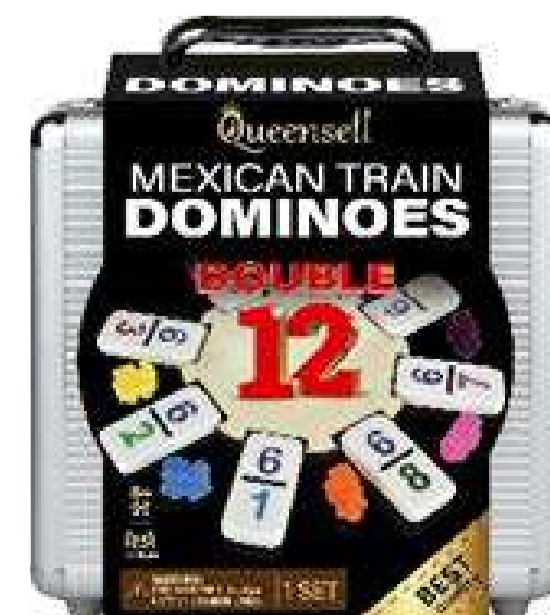

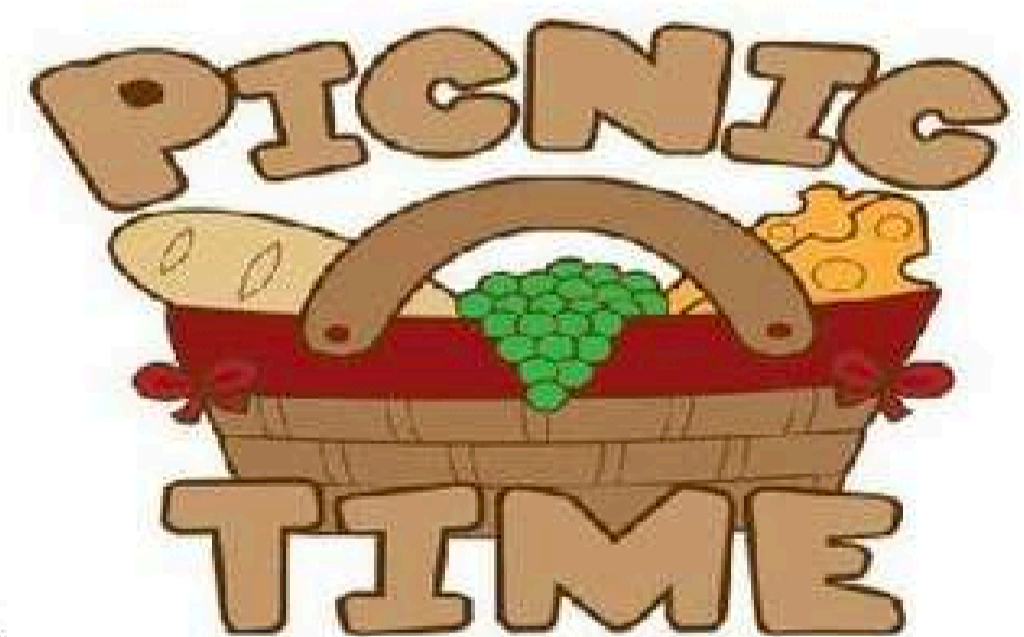
